Registration - General Terms and Conditions

These General Terms and Conditions are valid for each attendee registered at the *Neuroscience and artificial intelligence, mechanisms, perspectives & consequences* meeting, Bordeaux, France, 23-24 May 2024 (hereafter referred to as the Meeting). Any person, delegate, speaker or media representative is considered an attendee.

Meeting registration

The registration deadlines are as follows:
